



We greet all our readers with this new issue,

e continue to tell the whole world about the tragic night, the events and the national will that triumphed that night with the slogan "Continue in SOE", on the anniversary of the heinous attempt staged with the aim of invading Turkey. We were the first to talk about the background of this heinous attack and the events that took place during the invasion attempt in all its reality and through correct sources at 138 points in 60 countries. We continued to explain July 15th on the anniversary of July 15th Victory of Democracy and Martyrs' Memorial Day in a variety of activities ranging from exhibitions to panels, and book distributions to marathons. We will continue to explain July 15th to the world, hoping that such events will never happen again and may all our citizens who lost their lives rest in peace. We will never for-

get the martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the homeland and we will not allow it.

Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, teaching tens of thousands of people of different languages, religions, races and nationalities in five different continents of the world, brought together 700 students from 57 countries with Turkey, Turkish people and language this year with the Turkish Summer School that has been organized every year for eight years. Students who

have successfully completed Turkish courses in Yunus Emre Enstitüsü centres in their respective countries or who study in Turcology departments at universities abroad with which we signed protocols, took Turkish lessons at 23 universities in 22 cities, and visited those cities and neighbouring cities blending their Turkish and their feelings about Turkey with the ancient culture of Anatolia. The closing ceremony of the Turkish Summer School with an increasing number of students, was held under the auspices of Turkish President Mr. Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, at the veteran Presidential Complex of Turkish nation. We crowned the Closing Ceremony of Turkish Summer School held in this meaningful place, with greetings of Turkish President Mr. Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, Prime Minister Mr. Binali Yıl-

dırım and Minister of Culture and Tourism Mr. Numan Kurtulmuş. Our students sent us letters in which they shared their memories in Turkey where they spent nearly a month and their dreams for 20 years later. As Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, we will continue our struggle to fulfil the dreams in these letters entrusted to us on behalf of entire Turkish nation.

Although it was difficult, the month we spent together with 700 students ended with a farewell event in Istanbul. We bade farewell to "our children" who had "unforgettable memories" and experienced Turkish hospitality. We were left with thousands of words implying that they lived the best days of their lives in Turkey, the traces left behind from the emotions they brought

along with them and the tears they shed.




We also held the last Turkish Proficiency Test of this year in August. With the last Turkish Proficiency Exam of the year participated by nearly 700 candidates, the number of students who have taken the test since 2013 reached 4 thousand 900. The candidates both tested their Turkish skills and obtained a globally recognized language certificate.

One of the cultural diplomacy activities we carried out was the Turkey tour we organized for Chinese journalists in June. The reflections of their experiences in Turkey were also impressive. Journalists shared their impressions on Istanbul and Blue Cruise with the media outlets they work with in China. We once more realized that the centre we plan to open in Beijing, is an on-point venture.

In this issue, we will introduce the history and staff of Nicosia Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, which started its operations in foster-land Cyprus in 2015.

icosia Yunus Emre Enstitüsü was opened on December 1st, 2015 in Northern Cyprus, referred to as "Foster-land", "Green Island" and "Paradise Island" in Turkey. Turkish, initially spoken in Cyprus in 1571, still survives today as the official

language of Turkish Cypriots. For this reason, most Turkish language trainees in the Enstitü are visiting students from Northern Cyprus, foreigners living in the island and Greek Cypriot citizens. In addition, Enstitü continues to carry out protocol works with leading



Northern Cyprus universities on "teaching Turkish to visiting students".

Cypriot culture is an extension of Anatolian Turkish culture however having hosted various civilizations throughout the history, Cyprus has made an authentic synthesis. Revealing this cultural wealth and consolidating the cultural bridges between Turkey and Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus are among important missions of Nicosia Yunus Emre Enstitüsü. For this purpose, Enstitü has been working to revive the traditional Turkish handicrafts since its establishment

and organizes "Workshop Days" and "First Step into Art"activities, film screenings and interviews under "Turkish Cinema Days"; various concerts, exhibitions, and many conferences on Turkey and Turkish Cypriot culture. Located in an 800 years old historical building in historical Wall City in Nicosia, the centre organizes Turkish courses next to Ottoman Turkish and traditional handicraft courses. Nicosia Yunus Emre Enstitüsü that has attracted the attention of Turkish Cypriots since its opening, continues its activities with its staff of five, consisting of a director, lecturers and local staff.

The closing ceremony was attended by Prime Minister Binali Yıldınm, Minister of Culture and Tourism Prof. Dr. Numan Kurtulmus and Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş.

The program was also attended many guests, including Yunus Emre Foundation administration, ambassadors, mayors, foreign mission representatives, heads of partnering institutions, governors and rectors, artists, writers, foreign students studying in Turkey and managers of public institutions and organizations.

Pointing out that today diplomacy is not a task carried out solely through official contacts between countries, Yildınım stated that the young people now have a big share in diplomacy. Yildınım marked that the young people will become voluntary envoys of Turkey in their home countries and explained that throughout the program, the young students visited many cities in eastern and western Turkey, meeting with people and visiting natural beauties.

Prime Minister Yıldırım said, "This is a beautiful operation. I would like to congratulate Yunus Emre Enstitüsü on this occasion who conduced to this program."

Meaningful gift to Prime Minister Yıldırım from Somalian children


Following Prime Minister Yıldınm's speech, Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş presented the Prime Minister with "loh", a writing board Somalian students use instead of notebooks due to poverty, which features the quote "Do not be sad for Allah is with us" from the 40th verse of the Tevbe Surah.

Minister Kurtulmuş: "You have learned a language of heart"

Turkish Minister of Culture and Tourism Numan Kurtulmuş started his speech by expressing his gratitude and respect to President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, who encouraged the Enstitü from the day it was established and opened the doors of the Presidential Complex for

this activity by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü. I will keep the letter of my brother Muhammad, who sent me the letter, until the end of my life. A large part of Muhammad's dreams are those of 80 million people living in this country. We all dream that Palestine and Middle East will live in peace as in the past."

Prof. Ateş: "There is room for every nation in the shade of this tree"

Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş marked that as Yunus Emre Enstitüsü they offer services at a total of 138 points in 60 countries, and continued his speech as follows: "The common point which has brought us together with hundreds of young people who came to Turkey to participate in this program, is our language Turkish. We see Turkish as a tree with fixed deep roots, and with branches reaching to the sky. There is room for every nation in the shade of this tree. We are the heirs of a civilization which regards the differences on the world as wealth. In our opinion, different cultures, different

civilizations are means of getting together, meeting, and bonding. "Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, conjured in 2009 and has reached 60 countries with centres and liaison offices on five continents of the world, makes the deep-rooted voice of ancient Anatolian culture heard around the world. But we are not satisfied with that, and we will not be. We will make Yunus Emre Enstitüsü a global brand with your support and patronage. Today, the young people have shared with and entrusted their dreams to us. With this responsibility in mind, we will work diligently for a future in which the reality will go beyond our dreams."



The program started after the screening of Yunus Emre Enstitüsü and Turkish Summer School promotional film, and students from Azerbaijan, Albania and Palestine read their letters with the theme "Letters to Future 2017" explaining how they imagined the world of 20 years later. The letter Palestinian Muhammad Natse wrote about his dreams concerning the future, moved the audience. Ema Pavlakyte from Lithuania, who took the stage with Yavuz Bingöl in the program where local folk dances were performed, sang the folk song "Burası Muş'tur". Later, Yavuz Bingöl made a solo performance with his baglama, performing the folk songs San Gelin, Kara Tren, Yaylalar and Turnam. Many students in the hall accompanied the songs.

unus Emre Enstitüsü successfully brings the Turkish language and culture to four corners of the world through education and culture activities it carries out, teaches Turkish to tens of thousands of people every year in 5 continents of the world. Students who successfully completed the Turkish language courses of Yunus Emre Enstitüsü abroad and foreign students who study in Turcology departments of universities abroad, came to Turkey for the "Turkish Summer School" program. 700 students and trainees

from 57 countries visited numerous historical, geographical and cultural venues throughout the month, and participated in cultural courses such as marbling, pottery, cooking, baglama, and folk dances.

The common language of students from many different countries ranging from England to Russia, from Algeria to America, was Turkish. Thanks to Turkish language, students mingled in a short period of time, creating colourful scenes.

The students who visited the July 15th Martyrs'

Monument with guide teachers of Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, were informed on the events that took place on the bridge on the night of July 15th and the bravery of 250 martyrs who hindered the coup attempt. In addition to the architecture of the monument, 250 cypresses and rose trees representing the martyrs around the monument and the prayers read day and night, moved the students.

Turkish Summer School Students in Canakkale

Çanakkale was one of the hosts of the Turkish Summer School, held in 23 universities in 22 different cities of Turkey. Students who took Turkish lessons in Çanakkale TÖMER for four weeks also had the chance to visit historical, geographical and cultural attractions like Gallipoli Historical Peninsula and Battle Zones, Tenedos, Imbros, Troy, Gülpınar, Apollon Smithenion, Assos and Mount Ida.

The students had the opportunity to get to know

Turkish people and Turkey by improving their knowledge of Turkish in cultural courses such as marbling, pottery, cooking, folk dances and in excursions. A farewell night was organized for the students who came to Çanakkale at the end of the summer school.

TSS Students in Karabük

Within the scope of Yunus Emre Enstitüsü Turkish Summer School Program, another stop for students who visited Turkey between July 24th and August 20th was Karabük. In the program held in collaboration with Karabük University TÖMER, the students observed the daily life in the city as well as attending Turkish lessons. Students who went shopping in the bazaar, rode horses, and tasted Turkish delicacies expressed their admiration for the city.

Iranian Aida Vahid Muhammedi who participated in Yunus Emre Enstitüsü Turkish Summer School Program said that they came

to Turkey to learn Turkish and they had a great time. Muhammedi said, "After lessons, we participate in various activities. We tried marbling and archery as well as cooking dishes like stuffed leaves and dumplings. The city is lush, there are distinct houses. Actually I likened Safranbolu very much to Iranian cities. I did not feel like a stranger. I truly enjoyed it, and I would come again."

Turkish Summer School Students in Capital

This year, the program organized in Ankara within the scope of Turkish Summer School held with participation of 700 students from 57 countries, was hosted by Hacettepe, Gazi and Ankara Universities. Students from Senegal, South Africa, Tunisia, Albania, Philippines and Pakistan had the opportunity to get to know the capital by visiting the historical, cultural and social attractions of Ankara as well as attending Turkish lessons.

Students of Turkish Summer School visited important attractions in the city such as Anıtkabir (Atatürk's Monumental Tomb), Hamamönü, Eymir and Mogan Lakes, Altınköy, Wonderland, Göksu Park, Mavigöl, and Ankara Castle. In the

scope of Scientific Diplomacy Studies carried out by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, international Turcologists who had the opportunity to visit ODTU Technopolis, got the chance to learn about the ventures and various technological developments here.

Students who also participated in activities such as boat trips, archery, tiling training, marbling show, baglama concert, and picnic, visited Cappadocia and Amasra on weekends and



observed the natural beauties of Turkey. Teaching candidates who graduated from Turcology departments and Summer School students received their certificates after 4 weeks of training. At the ceremony, a short film on activities organized, was screened. The film featuring students' images moved the audience.

Cultural Envoys in Sakarya

The students who came to Turkey from 15 different countries for the Turkish Summer School Program organized for the 8th time this year, were hosted by Sakarya University TÖMER.

The cultural envoys, who got the opportunity to



visit the historical, tourist and cultural attractions of Sakarya, completed the 20 days long training and received their certificates from Sakarya University Rector Prof. Dr. Muzaffer Elmas. After the days they spent in Sakarya, the students who watched the short film titled Turkish, Turkey and Sakarya in which they shared their feelings and thoughts, had a souvenir photo taken.

Turkish Summer School Students in Bursa

The students who came to Bursa for the Turkish Summer School which organized for the eighth time this year and teaches viewing the world through the window of Turkish,

attended Turkish lessons and visited numerous historical, geographical and cultural venues. Students also participated in tile, calligraphy and marbling workshops.

Ankara University Turkish and Foreign Languages Application and Research Centre (TÖMER) Bursa branch hosted the students who visited the city, and the students who participated in the activity held at Bursa Metropolitan Municipality Art and Vocational Training Courses Erikli Vocational Training Centre, made stuffed vine leaves and rolled out dough to make pastry at the Ottoman Cuisine Workshop.

also stated that they liked the Çanakkale and İzmir excursions and explained that they both learned Turkish and got the opportunity to visit historical and touristic places. The students said that they liked Bursa and Turkish foods very much.

TSS Students in Karaman

Karaman group students who came to Turkey within the scope of Turkish Summer School, got







the opportunity to learn about Turkish culture and practice Turkish language on site.

The students said: "There was a mixed sense of curiosity and excitement when we were informed that we were going to Karaman. We had limited knowledge about cities such as İstanbul, Ankara and İzmir however we had no idea about Karaman. We were greeted by the warm smiles and hospitality of Anatolian people. We love Anatolia and its people. We would like to visit Karaman and other Turkish cities again. We would like to thank Yunus Emre Enstitüsü for this experience, Karamanoğlu Mehmetbey University and our teachers who have shown interest to us day and night."

Students got the opportunity to see Karaman's natural and historical destinations in addition to going on excursions to cities such as









Cappadocia, Konya and Antalya. They also got closely acquainted with and tried Turkish traditional arts as Turkish archery, marbling, and ceramics.

TSS Students in Nevşehir

Turkish Summer School students from 17 countries visited Nevşehir and got the opportunity to speak Turkish in its geography surrounded by Cappadocia's unique historical texture and aesthetic stance. Students who took Turkish lessons in Nevşehir Hacı Bektaş Veli University Turkish Language Instruction Centre, participated in social and cultural activities.

The students who got the chance to ride horses on banks of Kızılırmak, expressed how they enjoyed this experience. Students who also went on a gondola tour, relaxed in Turkish bath at the end of the day. Students who had the chance to participate in the traditional Turkish henna night, enjoyed the texture of Cappadocia during sunrise accompanied by hot air

The students of Turkish Summer School who met with whirling dervishes, learned about whirling philosophy from first hand and also met with folk poetry culture accompanied with baglama. In the program which was not limited to Cappadocia, the students visited Rumi and Shams mausoleums and Anatolian Seljuk History Museum and tasted authentic Konya



How did you decide to learn Turkish?

Because I love Turkey and Turkish language.

Were you familiar with Turkey? What have you heard about Turkey since childhood? What do you know about Turkey?

The ties of fraternity and friendship between Turks and Palestinians are very strong. We have strong historical relations, and shared histories. Turks have always been on Palestine's side. I've known this since I was a kid. This is why Turks are my dear brothers and sisters.

♦ When did you first visit Turkey?

I visited Turkey in 2016 for the first time to attend Yunus Emre Enstitüsü Turkish Summer School . This year I participated in the student group in Sakarya.

What are your impressions on Sakarya?

I loved Sakarya. A very calm, peaceful, lush city. People are as warm, hospitable and generous.



You are in Turkey for a month. Have you any favourite foods? Which is your favourite Turkish dish?

Palestinian and Turkish cuisines are quite similar. Especially Sakarya Kebab and Kemalpaşa dessert are my favourites. I also liked İnegöl Meatballs I had in Bursa. What is your dream for the future?

I want Palestine to become a free country like Turkey one day. I hope that one day Palestine will become a developed, powerful and independent country like Turkey. The Palestinians are entitled to it.

What is your biggest dream for the world?

I wish peace all over the world. I want wars to come to an end, never to happen again, and children to live happily in a peaceful world. I hope all these wishes will come true

In Turkey, there was a coup attempt on July 15th. How did you feel on July 15th?

I was in Palestine. We followed the events on television and social media. The news did upset and sadden us, we were very worried. That nightmare lasted until the morning. We prayed a lot for Turkey.

Those who staged the coup are enemies of nation and democracy. They are traitors for me. I do not like traitors because they do not like Turkey. They do not want Turkey to be a developed and free country. They do not want Turkey to help Palestine as well. They do not wish for Turkey to get better, become more developed, and peaceful.

Young people from 57 different countries visited Turkey with you for Turkish Summer School. How did you feel?

People from different countries and different cultures coming together is a tremendous wealth. We established new friendships, learned our differences, and discovered the common aspects. We realized how alike we are as people on various issues.

What would you like to say about Yunus Emre Enstitüsü?

I would like to thank Turkish Republic and President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan before Yunus Emre Enstitüsü. Yunus Emre Enstitüsü and universities hosted us very well throughout the Turkish Summer School program. Turkish people as a nation are very generous. I admire Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan. God bless him. I always pray for him and for Turkey. President Erdoğan has revived the sensitivity Sultan Abdulhamid showed for Palestine. I hope that with the support of your President and efforts and support of all conscientious people, Palestine will be a free and independent country like Turkey one day. I wholeheartedly believe in it.



unus Emre Enstitüsü held the third and last Turkish Proficiency Test of 2017 on Saturday, August 12th simultaneously at 32 test centres in 31 countries.

The Turkish Proficiency Test (TPT) taken by 666 candidates was held in two sessions. The reading, listening and writing skills of the candidates were tested in the first session; as speaking skills were tested in the second.

Successful candidates who want to certify Turkish language proficiency, will be granted the Turkish Proficiency Certificate at levels B2, C1, C2.

Number of applications increased by nearly 80%

Compared to September last year, the number of candidates increased by 80% this year. The highest number of applications to the test, held simultaneously at 31 countries, 32 cities was from Azerbaijan followed by Turkey, Bosnia-Herzegovina and Iran.

3250 candidates who were successful in the Turkish Proficiency Test taken by 4900 candidates since 2013, were qualified for the Turkish Proficiency Certificate.
