

Greetings to all our readers with our new issue,

YEE is the term president of the Global Public Diplomacy Network and we organized the 4th General Assembly Meeting of GPDNet in Istanbul in recent days. We have expanded the Global Public Diplomacy Network in order to maintain the intercultural communication network in a healthy manner. Qatar, Mozambique and Lithuania cultural institutes are among new members of the Global Public Diplomacy Network.

Following the official opening of our centre in South Africa, Johannesburg Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, with attendance of Minister of National Education Mr. İsmet Yılmaz, Turkish President Mr. Recep Tayyip Erdoğan announced the inauguration of Enstitü centres in Ukraine's capital Kiev and Venezuela. We would also like to share with you that we will speed up the process to open these centres and they

Minister of Culture and Tourism Prof. Dr. Numan Kurtulmuş also stated that the year 2018 is important in furthering the relations between the two countries and a centre is soon to be opened in Beijing. The minister who visited our Enstitü to observe our operations in place, underlined that Yunus Emre Enstitüsü will become one of Tur-

will become operational in the near future.

key's leading institutions in the field of cultural diplomacy. Our goal in this direction is to increase the number of centres until the end of the year and to have opened 100 centres by 2023 to bring Yunus' language to four corners of the world. With 54 centres and 139 contact points in 43 countries, we continue our efforts without slowing down.

Since our establishment, we have taught Turkish to more than 100 thousand trainees in as short as 8 years and it is a clear indicator of how fast we have made progress. We responded to the question "How can we bring Turkish language to people easier, faster?" by establishing the Turkish Language Teaching Portal. Through this portal, we have reached 30 thousand trainees from 83 countries in just only months.

We establish new collaborations with stakeholder institutions. We signed a protocol with Turkish Maarif Foundation in the field of "Teaching Turkish as a Foreign Language" within this direction. We aim to reach a wider geography with this collaboration that is a response to FETÖ and as institutes that serve transparently, we aim to provide better quality services in the field by taking strength from each other.

Our operations in the field of cultural diplomacy con-

tinue without ceasing. We celebrated the 25th anniversary of the diplomatic relations between Turkey and Croatia and hosted two concerts in Ankara and Zagreb on this occasion. Another important cultural-art activity is from Rome. With Presidential State Symphony Orchestra concerts held on two different days, we continue our efforts to consolidate the cultural bridges with countries which we have a long past.

In these days, as relations between China and Turkey gain momentum, another cul-

tural diplomacy activity we carried out was hosting the world famous artist Will Liu in Turkey. We host a large number of people from different areas in Chinese media in Turkey, provide them with the chance to observe our culture on site and aim to eliminate the wrong Turkey image attempted to be shaped, and see that these efforts receive feedback.

In this issue, we will introduce our third centre in Europe, Brussels Yunus Emre Enstitüsü that is one of our Windows Opening to the World.

We hope you will enjoy this issue.

Brussels Yunus Emre Enstitüsü which opened its doors in 2011, is the third Enstitü centre in Europe. In the capital with strategical importance, Brussels Yunus Emre Enstitüsü organizes a number of successful events in the fields of music, cinema, and literary and academic talks in collaboration with prestigious national and international partners.

Enstitü participates in many festivals with various themes organized in Belgium each year, inviting artists from

Turkey. In the culture festival where traditional and modern are blended with Turkey's cultural codes, a number of music, fine arts, photography, cinema, theatre, dance, literature, architecture, design, fashion and gastronomy activities organized, play an important role in promotion of Turkey. In the Europalia Festival, which aims to promote mainly Belgium as well as France and the Netherlands, Enstitü represented Turkey selected as the focus country with attendance of President Mr. Recep Tayyip Erdoğan.



In addition, Sharing the Daylight Exhibition that documented how different civilizations lived in harmony in Anatolia for thousands of years, was opened in 2012 and the Language of Rugs- Bayat Rugs Exhibition and Panel on rugs which is an essential element of Anatolian culture, was opened in 2013 in the EU Parliament.

In 2012, Enstitü became a member of the European Cultural Institutes Association Brussels Group (EUNIC-Brussels), and carries out a number of activities with other cultural institutes that are members of this group. Among these activities is Transpoesie Poetry Festival, organized every year on the occasion of the September 26th European Languages Day, and thanks to Enstitü's participation, Turkish is recognized as a European language. In addition, Turkey participates in activities such as European Literature Night, Documondays, Sursum Linguae, Pop & Shop Design Festival, Brussels Music Festival, Iris Festival, and Fête de la Bande Dessiné (Comic Book Festival).

Enstitü has supported the Turkish Research Centre opened in 2011 within Gent University since its establishment. In addition to academic seminars organized in the university, successful activities are held in multidisciplinary fields



outside the university. In 2015, "Turkish Department Library" was opened in Gent University. Within the scope of Turcology Project, "Seljuk and Ottoman History" courses were held in the university in 2015 and 2016 academic years. Enstitu also continues to organize Turkish courses for foreigners.

GLOBAL PUBLIC DIPLOMACY NETWORK REPRESENTATIVES GATHERED IN ISTANBUL

he 4th General Assembly of the Global Public Diplomacy Network (GPDNet), established in 2014 for development of bilateral and multilateral projects between countries and enables exchange of know-how in the field of public and cultural diplomacy, was held. Yunus Emre Enstitüsü is the term president representing Turkey, and the assembly took start in Istanbul on October 19th, Thursday. On the first day of the meeting attended by representatives from Sweden, Hungary, Poland, Portugal, Chinese Taiwan, Singapore, Philippines, South Korea and Nigeria, an international conference on "The Role of Public Diplomacy in Uniting Conflicting

Global Public Diplomacy Network (GPDNet)

The Global Public Diplomacy Network (GPDNet) was established by public and cultural diplomacy institutions of nine countries (Philippines, Sweden, Korea, Chinese Taiwan, Nigeria, Poland, Portugal, Singapore and Turkey) including Yunus Emre Enstitüsü from Turkey, in the capital of South Korea Seoul in 2014. With the addition of Hungary, the number of members rose to 10. GPDNet was established on October 23rd, 2014 with the aim of enabling exchange of theoretical and practical knowledge of institutions operating in the fields of cultural and public diplomacy in various regions of the world and devising bilateral and multilateral projects. Turkey is represented by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü and since 2016 Yunus Emre Enstitüsü is the term president of GPDNet.



Societies" and a panel on "The Future of Public Diplomacy" were held.

Speaking meeting's at opening ceremony that took place in the historical peninsula that has hosted various cultures for centuries, Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Seref Ates stated that the technology that has advanced particularly in the last 20 years in the world, influenced communication channels the most, and that the importance of intercultural communication is stronger than ever.

"Cultural diplomacy will bring peace to the world"

Expressing that culture and art establish bridges in diplomacy between countries, Prof. Dr. Seref Ates marked that GPDNet has undertaken an important mission in

this context. Ates stated that diplomacy has also diversified in the developing and changing world and that cultural diplomacy has become more important among traditional diplomatic channels. Expressing that as Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, they carry the culture, language of cradle of civilizations Anatolia to the world, Ateş said that they have built bridges of affection that reach four corners of the world. Addressing the work of GDPNet, Ates spoke as follows, "GDPNet is a structure that brings together international civil initiatives, within context of information and experience exchange. GPDNet will serve a cultural diplomacy understanding that works to establish a unique garden of civilization where works produced in other regions of the world, close or far, will come together freely instead of chaining



the world with concepts that are no longer geographical but political such as Far East, Middle East and West. We have organized a number of festivals, workshops, exhibitions with the aim of creating awareness and protecting cultural heritage and strengthening the ties between countries. In this context, we also hold this first international conference today. We aim to support these efforts throughout our three years of service and to strengthen this network by increasing the number of our members to achieve an ever-expanding structure."

"The only thing that will end hate crimes is cultural diplomacy"

Within the scope of the program that deals with the cultural aspects of cohabitation through cultural diplomacy, an international conference on "The Role of Public Diplomacy in Uniting Conflicting Societies" was organized with participation of academicians and respected field experts from leading world universities as Yunus Emre Enstitüsü Cultural Diplomacy Academy was the main coordinator.

Journalist and Political Scientist Brigitte Nacos from Columbia University, made



a presentation on the importance of public diplomacy in the age of global communication in the conference. Referring to Charlie Hebdo caricature crisis, Nacos said that when societies do not recognize the cultural values of one another, they do not realize the hate crimes they commit. She underlined

that when cultural sensitivities are not discussed, this leads to greater conflicts, normalizing racist rhetoric and hate crimes.

One of the speakers was King's College Strategic Communication Centre Director Neville Bolt, who addressed the role of communication and importance of social media in the field of public diplomacy. Bolt expressed that knowing only one's respective culture does not suffice and people must be informed to influence their behaviours, and stated that today public diplomats have become electronic envoys that collect data. Bolt expressed that public diplomats are people who understand the culture of their respective countries and ended his speech with a quote by Rumi: "Now it is time to tell new things."

The conference continued with the presentations by Bekir Karlığa from Civilizations Meeting and Former Ankara Ambassador and Chile Ministry of Defence official Luis Palma Castillo.

Castillo marked that social media platforms have become tools that create awareness on social and political issues beyond connecting people and are utilized by states as well as other actors. He underlined that if public diplomats manage this tool correctly, they can make







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valuable contributions to the humanity. The first day ended after the panel on "The Future of Public Diplomacy" which was broadly participated and a group photo shoot.

General Assembly meeting was held on October 21-22. General decisions regarding the future roadmap of GPDNet, the titles of projects to be realized, the global operations required in the fields of public and cultural diplomacy, procedures for granting and cancelling membership were taken. In addition, network membership statuses of participating institutions "Cultural Village Foundation (Qatar)'' representing Qatar, "Comunidade Academica para o Desenvolvimento (CADE)" representing Mozambique and "Institute of the Lithuanian Language'' representing Lithuania were discussed. Qatar was accepted as a full member to GPDNet while Mosambique and Lithuania were accepted as associate members.

The first South Africa branch of Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, which claims the important civilizations of Anatolia and carries the cultural heritage of these lands to various regions of the world, was officially opened on October 4th with attendance of Turkish Minister of National Education Mr. İsmet Yılmaz and Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş.

Minister Yılmaz: "Yunus Emre Enstitüsü will be the centre of love and brotherhood"

Minister Yılmaz expressed the following in his opening speech: "Yunus Emre is a rare figure who expressed the content of Turkish people's hearts in the simplest form. If we spread Yunus Emre's words to the world, we will make peace prevail everywhere in the world." Underlining that one of the most important means of promotion is language instruction, Minister Yılmaz continues as follows:

"We will introduce ourselves. Yunus Emre is one of the foremost institutions for this promotion. We take pride in our culture. We would like to present this wealth to our friends. We will make any job easier if we know each other. As Yunus Emre said 'Come, let us be friends, let us make life easy on us, let us be lovers and loved ones.' This hopefully will become the centre of love and brotherhood."

President Ateş: We bring the wisdom and tolerance of Anatolia to the world

Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş also thanked the Minister of National Education İsmet Yılmaz for his significant efforts in establishing the Enstitü and making it widespread. Stating that Yunus Emre Enstitüsü carries out more than 1200 activities annually, Ateş explained that the main purpose of these operations in countries where Enstitü centres are located is to increase the number of people who are in connection with and love Turkey.

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Ateş stated that the Enstitü brings the works of Turkish artists abroad as well as carrying Anatolia's wisdom, tolerance and human-oriented approach to the whole world.

Ateş ended his speech as follows: "Of course we do not just bring our own culture to the world; we also bring cultural motifs of countries we are active in to Turkey, which will contribute to us and our culture and improve humanitarian values. In this sense, there is a broad variety of cultural values particularly in South Africa. I believe there will be more contact with Turkey with this centre."

The opening ceremony was attended by Turkish Ambassador to Pretoria Elif Çomoğlu Ülgen, Turkish Maarif Foundation Member of the Board of Trustees Prof. Dr. Ahmet Emre Bilgili, Chief Advisor to the Prime Minister Dr. Cahit Bağcı, former AK Party Düzce deputy Prof. Dr. Celal Erbay, former CHP Denizli deputy Mustafa Gazalcı, Ahmet Yesevi University President of the Board of Trustees Prof. Dr. Musa Yıldız and Ziya Selçuk as well as representatives from nongovernmental organizations in South Africa and Turkish citizens who reside in the country.

Establishment efforts were launched in 2013, and the first activities were organized by 2016 in Johannesburg Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, officially inaugurated by attendance of Minister of National Education İsmet Yılmaz and Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş. The Enstitü that launched its activities to introduce Turkish language through trainings and to promote Turkish culture in the region, offers services in a historical building in one of Johannesburg's most prestigious districts Houghton (Oaklands). 49 students have enrolled in Enstitü's Turkish course since April 10th.







n the 25th year of diplomatic relations between Turkey and Ukraine, an important step was taken which will contribute to development of cultural diplomacy between the two countries.



Turkish Instruction in 4 major universities in Kiev

Yunus Emre Enstitüsü cooperates with universities in Ukraine within the framework of Turcology Project. Enstitü currently has Turcology Protocols in Kiev National Taras Shevchenko University, Lviv Ivan Franko National University, Odessa National Mechnikov University and H.S. Skovoroda Kharkiv National Pedagogical University.

139 contact points in 61 countries worldwide

Yunus Emre Enstitüsü which launched its operations in 2009, increased the number of centres to 54 in its 8th year of operation. Ateş said that they aim to increase the number of centres with operations to be carried until the end of this year. Yunus Emre Enstitüsü that teaches Turkish to thousands of people every year in numerous capitals of the world, aims to increase the number of centres to 100 worldwide in line with 2023 Vision.

Erdoğan: "YEE to Open in Venezuela"

Erdoğan issued the following statement after the meeting, "We signed important trade agreements. THY did not leave Venezuelan people alone. We had requests from our dear friend to make THY flights more efficient. In April, a delegation visited Venezuela and held a business forum. We made an agreement for inauguration of a Yunus Emre culture centre in Caracas. Former Foreign Minister Rodriguez had made a request to us for the construction of a mosque






in Caracas. We will display Turkish architecture when necessary conditions are met. My dear friend Maduro also expressed that he will provide assistance."

We will also take steps to open a Confucius Institute in Turkey in the same way. We have contacted some university centres. Therefore both the conference and the meetings with Chinese officials, have been beneficial."

Kurtulmuş: Confucius and Yunus Emre Enstitüsü are good opportunities

Minister of Culture and Tourism Dr. Numan Kurtulmuş met with his Chinese counterpart Luo Shugang in Beijing. Marking that there is a strong will to further the relations and cooperation between China and Turkey, Kurtulmuş said, "We must strengthen our collaborations in the field of tourism. Culture and tourism fields are the soft power which will strengthen all these collaborations. China declaring the next year as "Turkey Tourism Year' is the most important project of the Ministry of Culture and Tourism."

Minister Kurtulmuş said that the establishment of "Turkish-Chinese University", supported also by President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, is of great importance and said the two ministries should focus on this issue sensitively.

WILL LIU: I AM SO HAPPY TO BE IN





The star of "Where are you going Father?", the most watched reality show in China with a team of 800 people, and world famous Chinese actor and film producer Will Liu and his team visited Turkey as guests of Yunus Emre Enstitüsü within the scope of cultural diplomacy activities. Will Liu, stating that he was pleased to be in Turkey, said, "We are very excited to begin exploring the beauties of Turkey, a mysterious country for us. We are looking forward to making the projects here."

Will Liu visited Blue Mosque and Sultanahmet Square on the first day of his Turkey itinerary. Will Liu visited Hagia Sophia as the second stop of his Istanbul tour with his family he travelled to Turkey with, as required by the format of TV show "Where are you going Father?", and toured Istiklal Avenue after visiting Saint Antoine Church.

Liu visited the historical and tourist sites in Turkey between September 9th and 18th with a team including Chinese TV producer, film director, musician and businessmen, and met with business and art circles within the scope of YEE's cultural diplomacy activities.

Çavuşoğlu met with Chinese Star Will Liu

Minister of Foreign Affairs Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu gathered with Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş and famous Chinese star Will Liu, and discussed Turkey's goal of hosting 3 million Chinese tourists and publicity of Turkey in China. He received information about the projects to promote Turkey.

The visit is expected to contribute to the publicity of Turkey within the framework of Turkey's goal of hosting 3 million Chinese tourists as Minister Çavuşoğlu expressed in a joint press conference with his Chinese counterpart Vang Yi, held in China last month.



Hüseyin Yayman: A Major Coincidence

Will Liu later visited Deputy Minister of Culture and Tourism Hüseyin Yayman in Ankara. Reminding that the Minister of Culture and Tourism Numan Kurtulmuş visited China to hold important official visits, Deputy Minister of Culture and Tourism Yayman marked that it was a major coincidence that one of China's greatest artists visited the Ministry around the same date.

Yayman thanked Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş for organizing the meeting, and said, "We invite our Chinese friends to Turkey, through you. This is a mysterious country, the open air museum of the world. TV series and cinema sectors are very successful in this region with a story." Reminding that Turkey is the second country in the world selling highest number of TV series, Hüseyin Yayman said that Anatolia is the meeting point of civilizations. Yayman proposed Will Liu to make a film in Turkey and expressed that they would provide all kinds of support as the Ministry if a project is realized in Turkey.

Şeref Ateş: Such visits contribute to the relations between peoples

President of Yunus Emre Enstitüsü Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş thanked the Deputy Minister of Culture and Tourism Hüseyin Yayman for receiving them and spoke as follows:



"People communicate with each other through the screen because face-to-face communication is difficult in our age. In this respect, it is an honour for us to be hosting the prominent figures of China here. As the Enstitü, our field is culture and cultural interaction, so you may address Mr. Minister your questions regarding projects Will Liu and his team will carry out in this field with us in Turkey or for Chinese audiences. I also hope that this meeting will pave the way for such collaborations."

President Ateş expressed that he likes the show produced by the delegation member and actor Will Liu with his wife, children and father, and continued as follows: "If there is a good example for humanity, we adopt it from China no matter the distance. Because in our philosophy, there is the principle of 'seeking wisdom even in China'. I hope this visit will contribute to the relations between the peoples."

TRT Visit

Will Liu, who paid official visits to both ministries, visited TRT General Directorate in Oran for the last meeting in his Ankara itinerary. Yunus Emre has 54 centres in 43 countries, and 30 thousand trainees from 83 countries started learning Turkish in 3 months through distance education. There are 138 contact points in a total of 60 countries including the universities YEE signed Turcology protocols with.

Thanks to the Enstitü which offers education to a total of 40 thousand students in 154 schools worldwide, Turkish entered curricula of schools in Bosnia-Herzegovina, Georgia, Poland, Japan, Egypt, Montenegro and Romania as an elective or compulsory foreign language course.



COLLABORATION FOR TRAINING PROGRAM

Turkish-German RELATIONS CONFERENCE IN COLOGNE
