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Greeting to all our readers in the first issue of the new year,

ith "Turkey Academic and Scientific Cooperation Project (TABIP)" we initiated under the auspices of Turkish Presidency, we aim to carry out "scientific diplomacy" by correctly explaining Turkey's studies in the field of science. With the project, we aim to create Turkey's scientific and academic interaction basin as well as to closely follow the academic and technological developments and to build science bridges. We desire different nations to recognize Turkey not only with its culture

and arts, but also with its science and production. We carried out our first activity in the field of science diplomacy with the beginning of 2018. We brought Syrian children under protection in temporary shelters together with science in Mobile Mathematics Museum.

Kemankeş Project we realized in collaboration with the Archers' Foundation, continues at full pace. The interest in Turkish archery increases each day, which is expected to be included in the

World Intangible Cultural Heritage List by UNESCO. Our trainers who were trained in Istanbul in recent months and returned to their respective countries, have launched trainings in Turkish Archery courses opened in 16 countries. A total of 50 classes have been opened in our Enstitü centres and nearly 600 trainees have been enrolled. Following three months of training, most successful trainees in 16 countries will be invited to Turkey as part of Turkish Summer School. In addition, successful trainees will exhibit their skills in the contests to be held within the scope of Turkic World Games to be organized in Erzurum in August.

We have also launched the preparatory work for the 2018 Turkish Summer School. This year, we plan to host nearly 1000 students in Turkey with Turkish Summer School to be held for the 9th time this year. We will host those who aspire to learn Turkish as well as young people interested in Turkish cinema and those who want to learn about Turkish art, in Turkey.

Like every year, this year we also held the first Turkish Proficiency Test of 2018 in January. The interest

in the test we put into practice in 2013, increases each year. This year, there was a 60 percent increase in the number of applicants to the test compared to the previous year. Held simultaneously in 35 countries and 41 test centres and participated by a total of 1130 candidates, the highest participation in the test was again from Azerbaijan.

As an institution conducting Turkey's cultural diplomacy, we have been successfully representing our country in the field of cultural diplomacy for 9 ye-

ars with 54 Enstitü centres located all over the world and with our activities in the fields of education, science and culture-art. We continue to work with a number universities abroad without limiting our Enstitü's activities only to countries centres are located in. We have reached a total of 140 contact points in 62 countries and we have made two very valuable cooperation agreements with Dublin Trinity College and Setif II University in Algeria in recent days.

Lastly, in this issue we will introduce Warsaw Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, opened in 2013.
We hope you will enjoy this issue,



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FIRST TURKISH PROFICIENCY TEST OF 2018 HELD

Since July 2013 to date, as of September 1st 2013, the culture department, language and culture institute affiliated to Turkish Embassy in Warsaw continues its activities with an official status. Warsaw Yunus Emre Enstitüsü carries out scientific, cultural and art activities in collaboration with prestigious national and international partners such as Warsaw Royal Palace, Wilanow Royal Palace, Warsaw University, and Krakow Jagiellon University. In addition, Turkish courses are offered in four high schools in Warsaw, and Turkish is the compulsory second language in two of these schools. Material is provided to institutions that organize Turkish courses in cities outside Warsaw, such as Wrocław Białystok, Katowice, and Krakow.

Warsaw Yunus Emre Enstitüsü carried out culture-art activities in 26 cities across Poland in 2014, in the 600th year of the diplomatic relations between Turkey and Poland. Since Warsaw Yunus Emre Enstitüsü launched its activities in Poland, the number of students attending Turkish courses has grown by 65 percent.

Warsaw Yunus Emre Enstitüsü that also organizes exhibitions and conferences with European Union National Institutes for Culture EUNIC and Romanian Institute in Warsaw, carries out joint activities with municipalities and youth cultural centres, museums, picture theatres and libraries.



Turkey will also become a science centre of attraction for students who aspire to study in Turkey and scientists who want to continue their scientific studies. Thus Turkey will gain new scientists. With TABİP, it is projected for Turkey to become more competent in science, technology and innovation, and to take steps towards increasing high-quality production in line with Turkey's 2023 vision and goals.











Institutions in the field of science

Institutions and organizations like Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, active in the fields of culture and public diplomacy around the world, have expanded their fields of activity and has been working on science diplomacy. Some institutions that work in the field of science diplomacy are Science and Innovation Network SIN in England, Deutscher Akademischer Austausch Dienst (DAAD) in Germany, and Confucius Institute HANBAN in China. The British Council, a well-established and successful British cultural institution, carries out scientific studies under the auspices of the UK. In this context, the Academic and Scientific Cooperation of Turkey is carried out under the auspices of Turkish Presidency for the project to become effective and efficient, and for it to be taken more seriously by the interlocutors abroad.

Our Primary Goal is to Promote Turkey's Scientific Activities to the World

Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş, "By the end of 2017, Yunus Emre Enstitüsü has reached a total of 140 contact points in the world; 54 "Culture Centres" in 44 countries and more than 62 countries under the "Turcology" Project. Our primary goal is to utilize these international networks and the cooperation agreements we have made all across the world, for Turkey to establish collaborations in scientific and academic fields and to further its industrial and technological capacity. In addition, we also aim to maintain the cultural affiliation of Turkish scientists abroad as a natural partnership, to plan activities with them to ensure Turkey's scientific and technological development, to introduce scientists in Turkey, scientific studies and collaborations to the world to improve the visibility, activity and reputation of Turkey. CHILDREN MEET SCIENCE WITH THE

Mobile Mathematics Museum



obile Mathematics Museum launched by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü under the auspices of Turkish Presidency within the framework of the Scientific and Academic Cooperation of Turkey Project (TABİP), brings children together with science.

Launched by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü under the auspices of the Turkish Presidency, TABİP organizes various programs for creative individuals to apply new ideas and for young scientists to connect with each other. Mobile Mathematics Museum is one of Enstitü's scientific projects that aims to educate new scientists and to teach mathematics by integrating it with social life. The primary goal of the Mobile Mathematics Museum is teaching mathematics by materializing it, making it popular, and demonstrating its functionality in everyday life. Accordingly, there is instructional material on usage of each mathematical formula and their functions in real life in every station on the truck. Each of the 35 stations symbolizes and illustrates different mathematical formulas.

Launched by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü, the project targets Syrian children under protection in temporary shelters in Turkey, and is projected to reach nearly 45 thousand individuals between ages 6-18. Mobile Mathematics Museum that stopped over at

Adana Sançam Temporary Shelter regarded as the world's largest container city; will meet with children in Osmaniye, Hatay, Gaziantep, Kahramanmaraş, Şanlıurfa, Mardin, Adıyaman, Malatya and Ankara on February 1st, 2018. The project is of importance for promotion of Turkey's interest and contributions in science, mathematics and life sciences. At the same time, the project aims to promote Turkey in the field of science and strengthen Turkey's positive image.

ASSESSED PROJECTS CARRIED OUT BY THE ENSTITÜ

Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş appeared as an on-air guest on Spor & Spor TV show, broadcast on Ülke TV and gave information about the projects carried out by Enstitü in line with its objectives and goals.

Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş relayed that YEE which focused exclusively on Turkish instruction during its establishment years, continues its activities around five basic axes, namely cultural events, cultural diplomacy, institutional capacity and science diplomacy in addition to Turkish instruction, and also gave information about the projects Enstitü currently carries out.

We will host 1000 students this year in Turkish Summer School

Marking that one of these projects is "Turkish Summer School", Ateş underlined that young people selected from universities abroad with which YEE has agreements with and 54 cultural centres, were hosted in Turkey for a month and visiting students got the opportunity to personally learn about Turkey and Turkish culture in addition to crash Turkish language course.

Cultural interaction advances with Kemankes Project

Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş who commented on Kemankeş Project, realized by collaboration of YEE and Archers' Foundation,

stressed that this project has revealed Turkey's local and national values and a synergy has been created with the countries involved in the project. Ates marked that cultural interaction could only be achieved in this way.

100 thousand people learn Turkish online

Stating that with Turkish Instruction Portal, they provide services to those who aspire to learn Turkish in countries where Yunus Emre Enstitüsü centres are not located, Ateş added that they have reached 100 thousand users from 159 countries within a year.

Turkey's Science and Mobile Mathematics Museum

Emphasizing the importance of science diplomacy, Ateş informed that Mobile Mathematics Museum aimed at Syrian children between ages 6-18 who are under protection in temporary shelters in Turkey, is a project that serves this purpose. Within the scope of the project that aims to develop children's mathematical skills by offering a distinct reality experience with thirty-five special mathematical formula stations, the Mobile Mathematics Museum set off to reach 45 thousand people and it will also contribute to promoting Turkey's means and opportunities in scientific, academic and technological fields to the world.

Cuftinal Diplomacy Bull SESSIONS FROM YEE

unus Emre Enstitüsü launched the bull session series on "Cultural Diplomacy for Prospective Diplomats and Media Managers" in collaboration with various universities.

The first of the bull session series organized with the aim of further promoting YEE within the borders of Turkey was held on Wednesday, December 20th in Recep Tayyip Erdoğan University and was presented by National Defence University Rector Prof. Dr. Erhan Afyoncu.

Prof. Dr. Erhan Afyoncu began his speech by emphasizing the historical background of Turkish nation, and he said that Turks are a nation that cannot survive without establishing states. Marking that the policies followed by the Ottoman still have an influence today as they did in the past, Afyoncu pointed out that Ottoman was a state that was imitated and copied in the 16th century. Expressing that this structure went through a rapid transformation, Afyoncu said Ottoman diplomats and ambassadors always maintained the state's dignity in countries they visited despite this fact.

Afyoncu, who responded to journalists' question regarding United Arab Emirates (BAE) Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed's comment on the social media which drew reaction, said that Fahrettin Pasha was referred to as "desert tiger" and spoke as follows:

"For almost three years, a great Turkish commander defended Medina against the British. He took his place in the glorious and honourable pages of Islamic history. He defended Medina for three more months, until January 1919, despite state's surrender. He sent the sacred relics and manuscripts in those regions to Istanbul so that the British would not take hold of them. While some of the people there cooperated with the ancestors of today's British royalty, Fahrettin Pasha struggled so that the flag of Islam could not be hauled. He is one of the most prominent figures in Turkish history."

Afyoncu ended his speech after advising the prospective diplomats to read the memoirs of local and foreign diplomats and to improve their knowledge on historical background.

unus Emre Enstitüsü (YEE) added a new one to Turkey's operations in the field of cultural diplomacy. YEE President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş participated as the speaker in the bull session series organized to raise diplomats of the future.

In the bull session held on Thursday, December 21st at Gazi University Faculty of Communication, Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş pointed out the necessity of redefining cultural diplomacy, and underlined that Turkey must go beyond the existing criteria and introduce a new rhetoric to the whole world.

Pointing out that this can be realized with a certain philosophy and strategy, Prof. Dr. Ateş underlined that they have gathered the information from different centres of the world and have determined different strategies suitable for countries. Ateş who expressed that Yunus Emre Enstitüsü has a very important philosophy, said, "We love all those created because of the creator. So we want to share all our cultural wealth with other nations. But we need to strategize, plan and implement our practice."

Marking that it is a new period in international relations,

and anyone can take an active role in this period, Ateş said Turkey has come a long way in the last 10-15 years and YEE has also played its part in this regard.

Ateş also marked that the properties, production and quality of universities are decisive in the international arena, and said that within the scope of Turkey Academic Scientific Cooperation Project launched this year, the academic accumulation of Turkey can be introduced abroad and projects based on academic production in collaboration with Turkey, will be supported.

In the event, films that marked Turkish cinema were screened. On the first day the film 120 on Sankamış campaign, on the second day the film Chaos Class, and on the third day, the film Züğürt Ağa met with cinema lovers in Shköder.



"Turkish translation Awards "ARE PRESENTED

ehran Yunus Emre Enstitüsü presented the "Turkish Translation Awards" to the winners in the ceremony held. Translators who were placed, received their awards in the ceremony organized with the aim of encouraging interpreters who contributed to furthering of cultural and literary exchange between the two countries, as well as improving the quality of translations from Turkish to Persian.

Tehran Yunus Emre Enstitüsü Director Turgay Şafak, who made the opening speech of the award ceremony held on December 30th in Mahmud Afşar Foundation, emphasized that translation has an important place in transforming civilizations.

Dr. Behruz Beykbabaî, an academic in Allame Tabatabai University Turkish Language and Literature Department made a presentation about translations from Turkish to Persian following the Islamic Revolution in the ceremony Prof. Dr. Tevfik Sübhanî and Prof. Dr. Muhammad Taki Imami Hoyî were presented with letters of thanks for their contributions to the development of cultural relations between Iran and Turkey with their translations.

Kave Fazli Halef, who made a short speech on behalf of the jury committee, pointed out the erroneous approaches encountered in translations made from Turkish to Persian, and shared examples of the most common mistakes with the participants.



In the contest where a total of thirty-three works, including 16 novels, 4 poetry, 5 research, 5 children's literature, 1 essay, 1 journal and 1 biography were evaluated, translators with the best translations were determined by the jury.

Şehit Behişti University Faculty Member Dr. Ataullah Hasani was deemed worthy of award in research-review category; Arsalan Fesihi, Müjgan Devletabadi, Müjde Ülfet and Tehmine Zardeşt in novel and poetry categories; and Atusa Abkar in children's literature category.

The award ceremony ended with a music concert featuring selected works of traditional Turkish-Iranian music performed by Zühre Abdoli (tambour), Rüya Ahmedi (bandir) and Rüstem Heydari (balaban).

Jerusalem and Istanbul ON THE SAME CANVAS



rganized by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü in collaboration with Zeytinburnu Municipality, the exhibition titled "My Cities" by young artist Sündüs Recebi from Jerusalem, met with art lovers. The opening ceremony of the exhibition that features works which reflect the beauty and similarities of the two cities, was held on Tuesday, January 9th at Zeytinburnu Culture and Art Centre.

Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President Prof. Dr. Şeref Ateş made a speech in the ceremony. He underlined that the bridges between countries are built through art, and the Enstitü with a focus on human, aims to reach people by contacting art and culture centres, to reinforce the connection with world people, and the exhibition by the young artist from Jerusalem is one of the best examples to this. Reminding that the Yunus Emre Enstitüsü centre in Jerusalem opened two years ago, Ateş said, "Especially the state of Masjid al-Agsa, the ruined tiles there saddened us. So we started to think of a way to restore these tiles dating back to the Ottoman period, and developed a project. We brought artists to Turkey in collaboration with İznik Foundation to train tile masters from Jerusalem." Stating that artist Sündüs Recebi was among the artists who came to Turkey to receive training, Ates continued his speech as follows:

"It means a great deal to us to bring the countries closer through art, shared by people with people. At the end of our efforts in line with this goal, we will open our second centre in Ramallah in Jerusalem." Painter Sündüs Recebi underlined that there is a profound connection between Istanbul and Jerusalem, and that she attempted to illustrate this connection in his paintings. Recebi marked that he completed 28 paintings in a period of six months which do not adequately represent the beauty of Jerusalem and Istanbul however she did her best. She also expressed that exhibiting her paintings in Turkey and in her beloved Istanbul was a source of great pride and joy for her.

Curated by Mehmet Lütfi Şen, the exhibition titled "My Cities" was open to visit until January 30th.

Turkish Archery COURSES OPENED IN 16 COUNTRIES



he Kemankeş Project, realized by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü (YEE) in collaboration with Archers' Foundation in 2017, continues with Turkish archery courses opened all over the world. There is intense interest in Turkish archery expected to be included in UNESCO's World Intangible Cultural Heritage List this year. 50 classes have been opened at Yunus Emre Enstitüsü centres in 16 different countries and nearly 600 trainees have enrolled. The project aims to promote traditional Turkish archery around the world and to further intercultural ties by raising athletes in this discipline.



Turkish Archery Courses started in 16 countries from Malaysia to Germany, Japan to Morocco

40 foreign athletes who participated in trainings organized in the Archers' Foundation in Istanbul in December 2017, received intensive training in various subjects ranging from Ottoman range arrow marking to bow configuration and arrow shooting techniques to Turkish archery scoring system. Archers' Foundation Founding Member of the Board of Trustees Bilal Erdoğan, Yunus Emre Enstitüsü President







Şeref Ateş and Archers' Foundation Chairman Haydar Ali Yıldız presented the athletes their certificates. 40 trainees who returned to their countries after completing the training in Istanbul, teach Turkish archery to enthusiasts in courses opened in their respective countries.

The project primarily realized in 16 countries, is currently carried out in following countries: TRNC, Lebanon, Malaysia, Egypt, Poland, Sudan, Jordan, Germany, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Morocco, Palestine, Serbia, Iran, Japan, Qatar, Kazakhstan.

Archers Placed in Competitions to Visit Turkey

After the trainings in Yunus Emre Enstitüsü centres for 3 months, competitions will be organized with Turkish Archery scoring system in each country and competitors who are placed will be qualified to participate in 2018 Turkish Summer School. In addition, the winners from 16 countries will exhibit their skills in the competitions to be held in Erzurum within the scope of Turkic World Games in August.

Turkish Archery Publicity Events to be Organized in 16 countries

Within the scope of the project, conferences, exhibitions and performances will be held in 16 countries in April and May, to explain the history, philosophy and cultural perspectives of Turkish Archery, Archers' Foundation administrators, experts and athletes will attend the events.

rinity College Dublin signed an academic cooperation protocol with Yunus Emre Enstitüsü (YEE) which will fund a new assistant professorship in Turkish Cultural History.

YEE Lectureship will see a distinguished academic join Trinity School of Languages, Literatures and Cultural Studies's thriving Near and Middle Eastern Studies Department. In addition to the academic position, the agreement also provides an administrator and a programme of visiting academics and members of the Turkish arts and cultural community.

Students on these courses have the option of studying for a period in a range of Turkish universities.

Portal helps 100,000 people learn Turkish

The Yunus Emre Institute's distance learning portal has taught Turkish to nearly 100,000 users from 159 countries in six continents in a less than a year, according to the institute.

The portal has users mostly from Egypt, Syria, Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Algeria, Ecuador, Tunisia, Morocco, Jordan, Yemen, the U.S. and Germany, the institute said in a written statement on Jan. 20.

The Yunus Emre Institute is an official body providing services abroad to people who want to learn the Turkish language, aiming to improve friendship between Turkey and other countries and increase cultural ex-

The language portal has been operating since February 2017.

According to the institute, 57.63 percent of the portal's users are males and 42.37 percent are female.

The majority of the users are in the 18-34 age group at 76.23 percent, followed by the 35-54 age group with 19.03 percent and the 55+ age group with 4.73 percent.

Through the internet we are able to spread our Turkish language and culture. Students from one corner of the world to the other can now communicate with each other in Turkish," said Yunus Emre Institute head Seref

"The language portal has reached around 100,000 users from 159 countries since it started broadcasting in February 2017. And this number is increasing every day," Ateş added.

First Turkish Proficiency TEST OF 2018 WAS HELD



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unus Emre Enstitüsü (YEE) announced the results of the Turkish Proficiency Test (TPT), held simultaneously in 41 test centres in 35 countries on Saturday, January 13th. The number of successful candidates was 732 and the success rate was 65 % in the first test of 2018. In the test participated by 1130 people, 71 percent of the successful candidates were qualified for Turkish Proficiency Certificates at C1 level.

Turkish Proficiency Certificate

"Turkish Proficiency Certificate" granted to candidates who successfully complete the test, and prepared in accordance with proficiency definitions in the Common European Framework for Languages Text, aims to support Turkey's policies that facilitate admission of foreign students, and is an important gain for candidates.

Individuals who hold a Turkish Proficiency Certificate will be exempt from Turkish language preparatory class when they are eligible to study in any Turkish university. Turkish Proficiency Certificate is a great advantage in job applications for individuals who wish to work in companies that operate in Turkey or their respective countries, who aspire to become a Turkish interpreter or teaching candidates

60 Percent Increase in Applications

The interest in the test, put into practice in 2013 by Yunus Emre Enstitüsü for Turkish language to gain an internationally

valid standard test, increases each year. The majority of the applicants are young people between the ages of 16-25 and the number of applications to the test increased by 60 percent this year compared to the previous year.

There was intense interest in the test, and the highest number of applicants were from Azerbaijan. The test was held at three different points and there was record application from Azerbaijan with 629 applicants.

The second country with the highest participation was Turkey with 352 candidates. Approximately 70 % of the candidates in Ankara, were Syrian and Iraqi refugees hosted in Turkey. The cities with the highest number of applicants were Baku and Ankara, followed by Astana, Tehran, Cologne, Skopje and Amman.

Turkish Proficiency Test

The applications for the second test of the year to be held on May 5th, 2018 will be received on March 19th, 2018.

Applied periodically three times a year by YEE Exam Centre, the test is held in two sessions. Reading, listening, writing and speaking skills are tested in the first session, and speaking skills in the second. Total duration of the test is 180 minutes, and provided that candidates score a minimum of 12,5 points (50 %) in each skill section, those who have a score between 55-70 receive Turkish Proficiency Certificate at B2 level, between 71-88 at C1 level, and 89-100 at C2 level.
